D.P.W. Report

3/17/15

- The department continues to install new water meters at break-neck speeds (101) as of 3/17/16.
  
- Parker Septic continues to pump septic tanks. F.Y.I. the d.p.w. coordinates the routes for pumping as well as locating the tank lids, digging them up, and after they are pumped we restore the area.
  
- The first wastewater samples were taken at the lagoons today (3/17/16) to see if we are within the required parameters to start discharging treated wastewater. Discharging can take place between March 15<sup>th</sup> and November 15<sup>th</sup> , and we plan to start by the April 1<sup>st</sup>.

Fun fact: The city sewer department is allowed by the Department of Environmental Quality to discharge 300,000 gallons of treated wastewater per/day, or 73,200,000 gallons per/year
